Do you know someone who is struggling with money and would like free one-to-one support?

Who is it for?

Money Sorted is for

Anyone who is experiencing financial difficulties and worries and would like some support.

Living in either Derby, Derbyshire, Nottingham or Nottinghamshire.

Those who are unemployed or economically inactive but would like to move into employment, education or training

How is the project funded?

'Money Sorted in D2N2' is a project funded as part of the Building Better Opportunities program in D2N2 (Derby, Derbyshire, Nottingham and Nottinghamshire).

The project is funded by the European Social Fund and The National Lottery Community Fund.

97% of participants who exit the project report improvements in their financial management skills. (Based on 2020 data)

Project Aims

Money Sorted can provide support and personally tailored interventions for people experiencing financial difficulty.

It can help you take control, build your confidence and skills and help you tackle barriers and problems in order to improve your financial well-being for the longer term.

What does the project provide?

- A personal worker working with you (a 'Personal Navigator')
- Assessment of your financial well-being
- Personal action plan
- Help to improve your skills, knowledge and confidence with different money issues
- Support getting into employment, training or job search.
- Independent wellbeing and life skills workshops

On average, participants who exit the project increased their monthly disposable income from £19.61 to £98.45 (Based on 2020 data)

Eligibility

To access the project participants are required to prove they have the Right to Work in the UK and are either unemployed or economically inactive.

ID Evidence includes:

- Passport
- UK birth certificate
- Current Biometric Immigration document (Biometric Residence Permit)
- National Identity Card (EEA)

Unemployment evidence includes:

- UC Statement
- Benefit award letter

Participant support costs can be met by the project including:

- Childcare
- Interpretation and translation
- Travel
- One off items to help meet Action Plan goals

99% of participants exit the project feeling more confident about their financial future. (Based on 2020 data)
